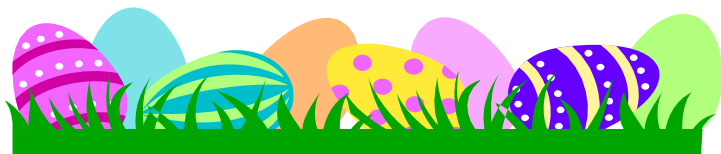

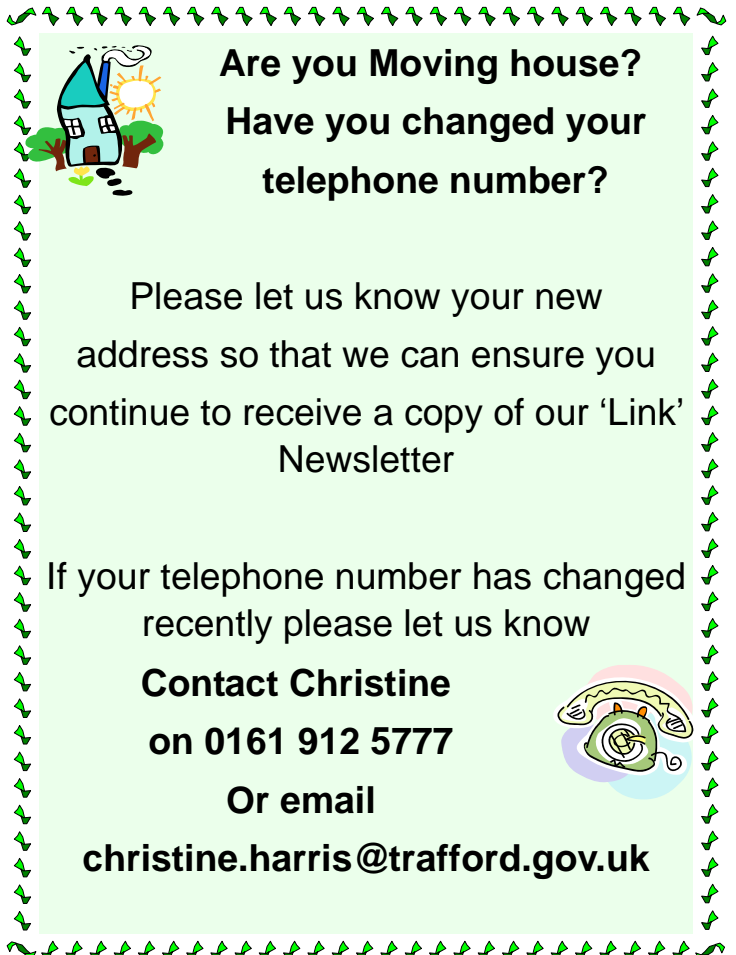

The 1989 Children's Act requires all local authorities to maintain a 'register' of children with disabilities in their area so future services can be planned and developed according to need.

RECORD

In Trafford this Register is called 'LINK' or Children's Disability Record. It provides information about health, welfare and educational needs of children and young people up to the age of 19. Inclusion on the Record is voluntary.

UPDATE

Registration will help the communication process between families, local authority, health and voluntary agencies.

Thank you to all parents/carers who have included their child/children on the Record and help with the bi-annual reviews which are essential to keep the Record up-to-date

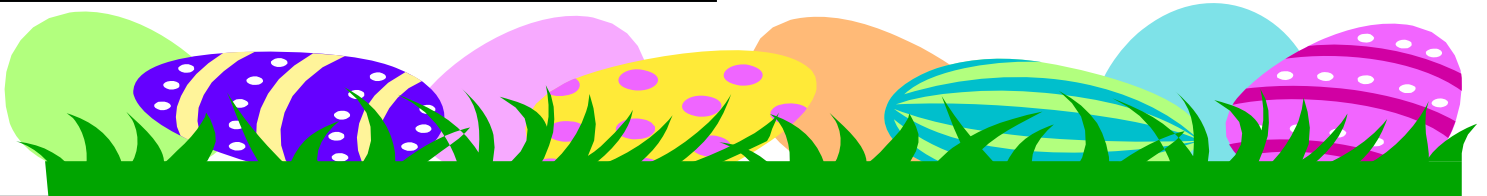

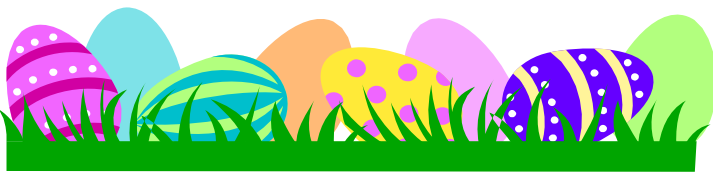
